Public health organizations acknowledge that participating in outdoor activities offers benefits to the physical, mental and emotional well-being of a participant.

The safety of our visitors, staff and community is our top priority. To better protect all those who come for rafting with us, we have implemented new standards and procedures. Of course, we will continue to monitor the daily progress of this pandemic and adjust our security practices accordingly.

What we want from you is:

- 1. Do not come for rafting, canyoning, trekking or any activity if you feel sick or have come in contact with a person who has been sick
- 2. Keep the necessary distances (1.5m) where possible
- 3. Wash or disinfect your hands often
- 4. Please bring a non-medical mask. A buffer or scarf is ideal, as this can be worn on the boat if needed. Have a container or bag to store the mask when not in use.
- 5. Ideally book a rafting trip, canyoning, trekking or any activity with your immediate family or close friends



Our responsibilities are:

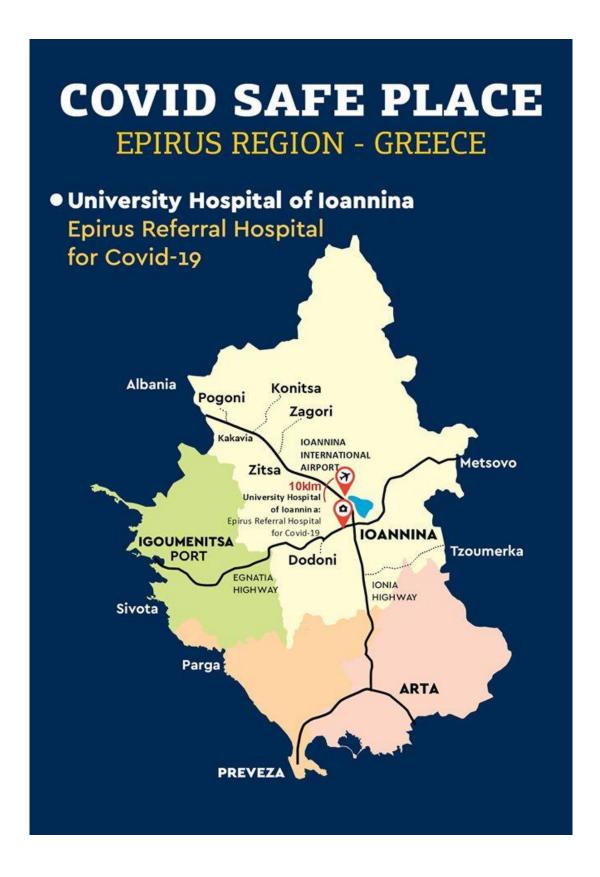
- 1. Provide a full refund for visitors who feel sick on the day of the trip
- 2. Daily monitoring of the health of all our employees
- 3. Strict enforcement of natural distancing at our base and on the river and a requirement for the use of MAP (Personal Protective Equipment) when this is not possible.
- 4. Maintain the distance along the route in and out of the river
- 5. Limit to the number of passengers per boat
- 6. Wipe and disinfect the bus before and after each route with steam and reduce the number of contact points at our base as well as on the bus
- 7. Training of our employees in improved cleaning and disinfection procedures
- 8. As always, life jackets, uniforms, suits, ropes and helmets will be properly wash, sterilized and decontamination(steam) between uses. Consider wearing your own outfit if you have one
- 9. Provision of hand disinfection stations



We hope that our environment will return to a normal, not-so-faraway future, but for now these protocols are our new reality. They will help keep everyone safe while allowing us to enjoy our beautiful rivers.

It is pointed out that the monitoring of the educational program for the health protocols has been done by our staff and ourselves, by the Region of Epirus. "Special health protocols on the basis of which tourism companies operate in the context of taking measures against COVID-19".
